Listening to God's Word Our Bible readings for Sunday 9th October are: 2 Kings 5.1-3, 7-15c & and Luke 17.11-19 **Warm Space 2022** - many of us are concerned at the impact rising energy costs will have this winter, particularly on those who have low or fixed incomes and tight budgets, and who may be vulnerable for other reasons. Appeal to assist with furnishing of accommodation for overseas priest shortly arriving on placement - a message from Archdeacon Richard:

St. Peter's Highfields has agreed to receive an overseas priest on placement for a year, following on from a request coming out of the Lambeth Conference received by Bishop Martyn. Whilst the national church will be helping with a stipend and the diocese will be providing a diocesan house for the priest and his family along with some resettlement grants, there is a need to assist the family with furnishing the property as they will not be bringing any furniture of their own. We should therefore like to appeal for offers of any good quality furniture or furnishings that may not be required for use over the next 12 months. Offers of the following types of furniture and furnishings would be very much appreciated: Beds (one double and 2 single), wardrobes (x 4), chest of drawers (x 4), bedside tables and lights (x5), curtains, kitchen table and chairs, lounge armchairs, sofa, coffee table.

Growing Gratitude and Generosity

As October began, we celebrated our Harvest Festival, remembering God's goodness to us in creation, and the call to treasure and protect the natural world. At this time of year, we consider all that we have received from God and from others, much of it undeserved and without our

asking. There is then a natural bridge from *gratitude* for the kindness of others, to being impelled towards *generosity* ourselves; from looking inwards we know we must now look outwards.

Over the main Sunday services in October, we will therefore be looking at **Gratitude and Generosity** in our own lives. In times of economic challenge, like this autumn and winter, it's tempting to hold on tightly to what we have – but God calls us to keep looking out for the needs of others, and promises to keep blessing us as we do so. To help us, we need reminding of this essential link between gratitude and generosity, and encouragement to keep on giving. On 30th October (the fifth Sunday) we will join with our friends at St Guthlac's for a combined service that will look at being '**Generous Together'**."
