

Diocesan Synod meeting - September 2022

Diocesan Synod met at Christ the King, Beaumont Leys on Saturday 24 September for a meeting that was largely given over to discussion of, and reflection on, Living in Love and Faith (LLF), the Church of England's conversation and discernment process about identity, sexuality, relationships and marriage. As befits a very sensitive and difficult subject, the discussions took place in an atmosphere of respect and care with speakers covering various themes interspersed with prayer and small group discussion. Creating a 'Warm Lounge' in the Parish Centre: The PCC have agreed that the Cottage Room in the Parish Centre (the small room just inside the front door on the left) should be adapted to become a 'softer' welcoming small lounge room, with carpet, fresh decorations and some fresh furniture. This will provide us with a space for small group meetings, pastoral conversations, a 'warm space' for the community if the winter is hard, and an attractive room of a different style for hiring out to other groups.

Step One is to clean and decorate the room, so we've put aside Saturday 29th October to do as much as we can. If you're able to drop in and join our team for any length of time from 10am onwards (until about 5pm), then we'd love to have your help. Dean David appointed as new Dean of Canterbury

Her Late Majesty The Queen approved the nomination of The Very Revd Dr David Monteith, Dean of Leicester, for election as Dean of Canterbury and his appointment was announced on 11 October. Dean David, who is also the Chair of the College of Deans of the Church of England, will be installed at Canterbury Cathedral at 3pm on Saturday 17 December. He will lead his last Leicester Cathedral service as Dean of Leicester at St Martins House, Leicester, at 10.30am on Sunday 27 November and a Farewell Evensong Service will be held at St Mary de Castro Church in Leicester at 7pm on Sunday 27 November. Further details of all these services will be publicised nearer the time.

Leicester Cathedral's Canon Missioner and Sub-Dean, the Revd Canon Karen Rooms, has been announced as Acting Dean of Leicester for the interim period before a new permanent appointment is made. She will lead the Cathedral community through the current period of change whilst the building remains closed for the ongoing Leicester Cathedral Revealed work into autumn 2023.

The Bishop of Leicester has said that Dean David has had a distinguished ministry and would be greatly missed but will go with 'our love and prayers.'



Growing Gratitude and Generosity

As October began, we celebrated our Harvest Festival, remembering God's goodness to us in creation, and the call to treasure and protect the natural world. At this time of year, we consider all that we have received from God and from others, much of it undeserved and without our

asking. There is then a natural bridge from *gratitude* for the kindness of others, to being impelled towards *generosity* ourselves; from looking inwards we know we must now look outwards.

Over the main Sunday services in October, we will therefore be looking at *Gratitude and Generosity* in our own lives. In times of economic challenge, like this autumn and winter, it's tempting to hold on tightly to what we have – but God calls us to keep looking out for the needs of others, and promises to keep blessing us as we do so. To help us, we need reminding of this essential link between gratitude and generosity, and encouragement to keep on giving. On 30th October (the fifth Sunday) we will join with our friends at St Guthlac's for a combined service that will look at being *'Generous Together'*. "
