- Please talk to the sidespersons if you have any other questions and do please stay after the 10.00 am service for tea or coffee and introduce yourself to some of us.

The responses that have come in so far are very varied, so we really need to hear every voice in order to make sure that God's call comes through clearly. Please do continue to talk with each other about your own understandings of the past, present and future, as this conversation too will help us discern the way forward. *Adrian*

## THE EUCHARIST EXPLAINED

#### What is the Collect?

The Collect is a short general prayer used in many traditional Christian services since as early as the 5th century. The Latin word 'collecta' means the gathering of the people together, and this is exactly what the Collect does when used near the beginning of the service.

Collects normally follow the same structure and pattern of five parts. First there is an address to God, then a description of some aspect of God's being, followed by a request, then a hope or aspiration, and then finally the 'pleading' through the work of Jesus. The original Latin collects were usually written as a single flowing sentence, and modern versions often try to retain this structure and form.

In the Church of England the Collect is different each week but the same prayer is used across the whole church and so it really does 'gather the people together' before we celebrate the Eucharist. *Adrian* 

## **CONFIRMATION SERVICE**

**Is this your next step on the journey of faith?** It may be that for a while now you've been thinking about our Christian faith and have a feeling that you should take another step forwards....and that step could be 'confirmation.' In the Church of England, the service of confirmation is a chance to 'confirm' that the promises made on your behalf at baptism (often when you were a baby) are now your promises too - a clear intention to follow Jesus in a life of faith.

A confirmation service is always taken by a Bishop and often includes 'candidates' from several churches. You can be confirmed at any age, as long as your supporting Minister has spent some time with you first talking about the basics of Christianity and your faith. Our next local confirmation service is at the Cathedral on Easter Saturday (31st March) at 6pm so if you'd like to join others in thinking more about this next step on your journey of faith do please let Adrian know as soon as you can (0116 270 4268 adrian.jones@zoho.com ).

ASH WEDNESDAY AND LENT:

This year Ash Wednesday falls on Valentine's Day, **14th February**. As usual we will be having an evening service for the whole Benefice, this year at St Guthlac's. Please do think about coming - as well as marking the start of Lent, this service is a time for being honest with God and ourselves, a time for facing our weaknesses and frailties but also for receiving the assurance that God is with us within our struggles to give us strength and bring change.

Lent is often a time for Christians to take up a spiritual or practical challenge for 40 days until Easter - you can do this for example, through the Christian Aid 'Count Your Blessings' booklet (available at the back of church), the Tearfund Lent Devotional (found here www.tearfund.org/en/lent\_2018/) or the 40Acts Generosity Challenge (at www.40Acts.org.uk). Some people prefer to read a Christian book divided into 40 short sections, such as the Archbishop of Canterbury's Lent Book 2018, 'Say it to God: In Search of Prayer' by Luigi Gioia. If you'd like a copy for just £5 please let me know before 7th February.

Our Lent Group this year begins on **Wednesday 21st February**, in the morning 10-11.30am at the home of Doreen White, 2 Shanklin Gardens, and in the evening 7.30-9pm at the Vicarage, 5 Church Lane. Our theme is 'Singing the Faith' and we'll be exploring five great hymns and how they help us understand the events leading to Easter. #### "We will remember them"

These are words we say every year. This year is the centenary of Armistice Day. St Mary's will be hosting a number of events from 7th - 11th November. From poppies, both real and knitted, to displays of photographs and the printed histories of some of the men whose names are on the memorial in the Lady Chapel. During the year the names of those who fell during 1918 will be read out at a Sunday service, nearest their death.

There will an invited speaker on the morning of the 8th November, educational visits will be offered plus an Open Church weekend where light refreshments will be available. The week will culminate with a combined service with St Guthlac at St Mary's at 5pm 11th November.

How can you help? In lots of ways. Knit poppies or scour your loft for any artefacts or photographs of people who had an association with Knighton during 1914 -1918. There is a list at the back of church of who is doing what to make this joint event with St Guthlac something we will remember for a long time.

#### **Bishop Martyn's School of Prayer 2018**

All Christians know that prayer is a vitally important aspect of discipleship, and that is both a discipline and a joy. In prayer we open ourselves to God, and are drawn into relationship with Him, into peace and joy. But despite knowing all that, prayer sometimes seems difficult.

Bishop Martyn will be leading a School of Prayer at Launde Abbey, from **9th-13th May**, with worship, teaching, conversation, and workshops around the themes of Prayer and Scripture, Prayer and Silence, and Prayer and Social Action. He will be assisted by a team that includes David Newman (Warden, Launde Abbey), Helen Newman (Chaplain, Launde Abbey), Chris Webb (Spirituality Advisor to the Diocese and author, as well as a resident artist and a resident musician.

Bishop Martyn, who describes prayer as 'a foretaste of heaven' says: "I hope this School of Prayer will help people grow and develop in their own prayer lives. This is an open invitation for anyone at all, whether you're experienced in prayer or feel yourself to be a complete novice: come and join us."

Although anyone can book for all five days and stay residentially at Launde, we are hoping to organise a group of day visitors from St Mary's and St Guthlac's to attend together, probably on **Thursday 10th May**. The cost of £37.50 includes coffee, lunch and tea, but if this feels beyond your pocket then please do mention this to me. As we'll need to book well in advance, please let me know if you'd like to come as part of our group by Sunday **25th February**. I'll collect money closer to the time. *Adrian*
