Firstly on **Wednesday 3rd July**, at 7.30pm, there will be a special service of Choral Evensong at St Mary's, led by the Benefice Choir under the direction of the Revd Canon Dr Stephen Foster.

On **Thursday 4th July** Matthew will join us for the 9.30am midweek Eucharist at St Guthlac's, which will be followed by coffee and cake.

Then on **Sunday 7th July** we will welcome the family at our 10am All Age Worship at St Mary's, which will be followed by a "bring and share" picnic in the park across the road.

ABOUT OUR SERVICES

- Our worship follows the printed order of service Large print versions are available from the sidespersons (the welcomers at the door). If you are using a hearing aid, please switch it to the T position so as to make best use of the hearing loop system.
- It is traditional to stand for the hymns and some of the prayers and readings, but if this is difficult for you then please do remain seated and comfortable.
- In the entrance area are toilets, and there is a crèche area at the back of the church.
- During the main 10am service, Sunday Club for children meets in the Narthex as usual; the children go to their Club after 'A Word for the Children'.
- As part of the 8.00am service we share Communion together and everyone is invited to come forwards to receive bread and wine as we remember the sacrifice of Jesus Christ. If you would prefer to come for a blessing then simply carry the service booklet with you.
- You are welcome to join Adrian for a short time of prayer before the main service: 9.30-9.45am at the front of the Lady Chapel (the chapel on the left).
- Please talk to the sidespersons if you have any other questions and do please stay after the 10.00 am service for tea or coffee and introduce yourself to some of us.


The campaign to save our spire

We now have a fund-raising committee, whose role is to define and market the spire project, encourage people throughout the community to get involved, and approve and schedule specific fund-raising proposals.

The aim is to raise £40,000 from our own local efforts towards the estimated cost of £200,000.

This is not only about bricks - or stones - and mortar; or about heritage - important though those things all are. Like our medieval predecessors who built the tower and added the spire, this is about calling out to our community, involving them, telling we are here. And why.

We hope everyone in the congregation will be proud to support and take part in this project.



It should also be a lot of fun. We have already come up with an impressive list of possible events, including the Christmas tree festival this December, and an open gardens weekend across Knighton next year. There will be a formal launch in September, but there will be plenty happening before then.

Don't assume we've already thought of everything. More ideas are very welcome. So are people willing to take a lead in organising specific events: one small co-ordinating group can't do it all. In particular we are also looking for someone with design skills to help with posters and publicity, someone with website design skills and another someone who will help us with the process of registering the church as a film location.
