Diocesan Service of Commemoration and Thanksgiving on Sunday 18th September 2022

All are welcome to attend a formal Service of Commemoration and Thanksgiving for Her Majesty Queen of Elizabeth II at **St James the Greater Church, Leicester , at 5.30pm on Sunday 18 September**, the eve of the State Funeral at Westminster Abbey. The service will be led by the Dean and Bishop of Leicester and attended by senior clergy and other faith and civic leaders from across our city and county. It will be open to members of the public to attend on a first come, first seated basis and will also be livestreamed online through the Cathedral You Tube channel. Doors open at **4.30pm** and please be seated by **5pm**.

We are all also being encouraged to hold a **2-minute silence at 11.55am** on the day of the funeral itself.
