We will continue to offer **communion** as wafers only and will not use the altar rail as yet. Please keep your mask on as you wait to receive.

Please remember to give each other **space at coffee time**, particularly if you take your mask off to drink – please spread out in the building rather than bunch together in the Narthex.

In summary, please do continue to act kindly towards each other, try not to take offence easily and to make allowances for others who may be more or less cautious than yourself. Our fellowship together is much more important than getting everyone to agree with us!

## Isaiah 43.1-7

# **Israel's only Saviour**

**43** But now, this is what the LORD says – he who created you, Jacob, he who formed you, Israel:

'Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are mine.

<sup>2</sup> When you pass through the waters, I will be with you;

and when you pass through the rivers, they will not sweep over you.

When you walk through the fire, you will not be burned; the flames will not set you ablaze.

<sup>3</sup> For I am the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Saviour;

I give Egypt for your ransom, Cush and Seba in your stead.

<sup>4</sup> Since you are precious and honoured in my sight, and because I love you,

I will give people in exchange for you, nations in exchange for your life.


<sup>5</sup> Do not be afraid, for I am with you; I will bring your children from the east and gather you from the west.

<sup>6</sup> I will say to the north, "Give them up!" and to the south, "Do not hold them back." Bring my sons from afar and my daughters from the ends of the earth – <sup>7</sup> everyone who is called by my name, whom I created for my glory, whom I formed and made.'

# Luke 3.15-17, 21-22

<sup>15</sup> The people were waiting expectantly and were all wondering in their hearts if John might possibly be the Messiah. <sup>16</sup> John answered them all, 'I baptise you with water. But one who is more powerful than I will come, the straps of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. He will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. <sup>17</sup> His winnowing fork is in his hand to clear his threshing -floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but he will burn up the chaff with unquenchable fire.'


