QUESTIONS JESUS ASKED (WHAT IS HE ASKING YOU?)

Last week we began a new series of sermons for the autumn season, looking at questions that Jesus asked of his disciples, the crowds who followed him, the religious people and the unbelievers.... and perhaps to us as well.

The ten questions come from all four of the Gospels and will help us to think a little more deeply about the implications of our faith, and what it means to follow the way of Jesus in the 21st century as well as the 1st. Here are the Sunday dates and subjects for the autumn:
