'Faith for Life' - following the way of Jesus

Today we begin a new series of services and sermons based around the teaching of Jesus in the 'Sermon on the Mount' from Matthew's Gospel.

In these familiar passages (and some not so familiar) Jesus maps out what it means to live the life of faith and to follow in his way daily.

Each time we share the Eucharist at our main 10am service we will remember the sacrifice that Jesus made for us, and also remember the pattern he gave us for a life that reflects the love and commitment to others that led him to that sacrifice.

Today we begin with the Beatitudes.

ABOUT OUR SERVICES

- Our worship follows the printed order of service and the readings and hymns are on an additional sheet. Large print versions are available from the sidespersons (the welcomers at the door).
- If you are using a hearing aid, please switch it to the T position so as to make best use of the hearing loop system.
- It is traditional to stand for the hymns and some of the prayers and readings, but if this is difficult for you then please do remain seated and comfortable.
- In the entrance area are toilets, and there is a crèche area at the back of the church. Sunday Club meets in the Narthex for primary school age children.
- As part of each service we share Communion together and everyone is invited to come forwards to receive bread and wine as we remember the sacrifice of Jesus Christ. If you would prefer to come for a blessing then simply carry the service booklet with you.
- At 10.00am, non-alcoholic communion wine is available on request in the Lady Chapel (to the left) and gluten free wafers on request at the main Communion rail.
- You are welcome to join Adrian for a short time of prayer before the main service: 9.30-9.45am at the front of the Lady Chapel (the chapel on the left).
- Please talk to the sidespersons if you have any other questions and do please stay after the 10.00 am service for tea or coffee and introduce yourself to some of us.

Third Sunday: TOUGH TIMES & HARD QUESTIONS

As we begin a new decade, our world faces unparalleled challenges.

How can we find a way to tackle together the major issues that are shaping our future, despite the deep disagreements that divide us?

Does the ancient Christian faith have anything to say about our contemporary challenges?

On the **Third Sunday** of each month at St Mary's, Knighton, we will take one of these hard questions and consider a range of views and responses. In particular, we will ask how the Bible, and our Christian tradition and experience, might inform and shape our thinking and our action.

Our 10am service on the **Third Sunday** will introduce the theme. Then there will be an evening opportunity for discussion and learning from each other, reflection and simple shared Night Prayer, in the Parish Centre from 7.30-9pm. You are welcome to either or both.

Sunday 19th January — "Can we disagree well?" (but no evening meeting)

Sunday 16th February - "Climate Emergency? What shall we do?"

Sunday 15th March - "Fake News or False Truths? Does it matter?"

CHALKING THE DOOR: AN EPIPHANY HOUSE BLESSING.

"Chalking the door" is an ancient Christian tradition that is once again becoming popular. It is a way to celebrate and literally mark the occasion of the Epiphany and God's blessing of our lives and home. Remembering how the Three Kings sought out Jesus at home and in his family, we ask for God's blessing on our own homes, families and all who visit us, as we start a New Year.

This year, our prayers are symbolised by using the markings 20+C+M+B+20. The numbers remind us of the year and the letters stand for the Latin phrase 'Christus mansionem benedictat' or "May Christ bless the house." They could also stand for the legendary names of the Three Kings (Caspar, Melchior and Belthazar).

To 'Chalk the Door' this Epiphany, follow these simple steps: First gather your 'household' outside, by the door - all who want to share what you are doing. If you live alone, consider asking a friend or neighbour to join you. Then pray- using the prayer below, or something similar. *Peace be to this house and to all who enter here.*

Amen

Amen.

Loving God, bless this household we pray, with faith, compassion and generosity; with health, peace, love and joy.

May everyone who comes to our home this year know that they are truly welcome,

And, as we share with both friends and strangers, may we also know that Jesus is with us, revealed to the world as your Son and our Saviour.

Write the inscription - with a piece of chalk, mark the lintel of the door or porch, or a wall close to the door, with 20+C+M+B+20, as you do so saying 'May Christ bless our home and remain with us throughout the new year.'

To encourage you, there is a basket of free chalk at the back of the church! Do please take a piece on your way home today. Although the chalk will fade over the course of the year, God's presence and blessing will stay with us. *Adrian*
