The Eucharist Explained

Prayers of Intercession

People of all faiths and none find themselves praying, sometimes intentionally and sometimes not. For some people prayer comes easily but for many it can be difficult to find the words to express a feeling or concern, especially when the problem or question in front of us seems to be so large or even overwhelming.

This is why we usually have prayers that are already written when we come to 'Prayers of Intercession' in our Eucharistic service. These are principally prayers for other people and they are placed after the readings and sermon as part of our response to what God is saying to us. Our modern Anglican prayer book, 'Common Worship' suggests some forms of prayer and a general structure, which are helpful, but each person praying can write their own prayers to reflect what is happening in the world and in our neighbourhood at the time. There is often a response, a line that the whole congregation repeats, that reminds us that we are all praying here together. Adrian

WANTED! Church Wardens and PCC members: At our Annual meeting in April we need to elect two new Church Wardens and three PCC members. Can I encourage everyone to pray and think carefully about who might be called to these important roles in the guiding and shaping of our life together as a church?

The most important qualification for either of these roles is having a loving commitment to St Mary's Church - both to the people and to the buildings and other resources that God has blessed us with. I believe and trust that God's future for us is bright and good - although some things will be different - and that within our Church family God has already given us the people we need to share in the task of leading us into that future - we just need to discover who they are!

Church Wardens have a part in overseeing all aspects of the growth and development of our Church life, as well as it's day to day running. The key elements of their role are:

- to represent Church members;
- to work with, support and advise the Vicar and PCC;
- and to ensure the efficient operation of the buildings, finances and administration of the Church.

But that does not mean they have to do everything themselves! We are fortunate in having a large and experienced team of people who are already committed to many aspects of church life, and a group of former Church Wardens and Deputy Wardens who are happy to assist and give advice.

PCC members meet together to share their understanding of our church life and needs, to offer constructive advice and questions to the Wardens and Vicar, and to make decisions about some important policies and procedures. Each PCC member brings their own skills and experience and it is healthy therefore to have a good mix and balance of gender, age and background amongst our PCC.

If you have even the smallest thought that one of these roles might be for you, then please do talk to Adrian, Neil, Patrick or Ros (the current Wardens) or to a member of the PCC, so that we can encourage you and answer any questions. If you can see the qualities we need in someone else then please do talk to them and encourage them to consider standing. Thank you!
