There will be no Compline next week (21st) but we will meet online as usual on Wednesday 28th December.

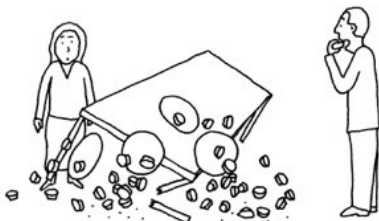

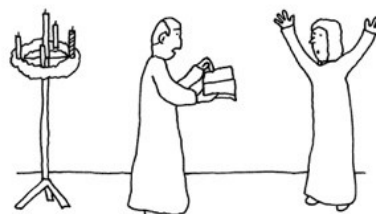

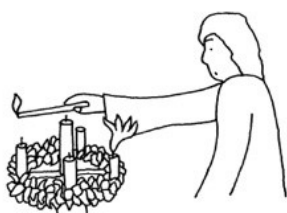

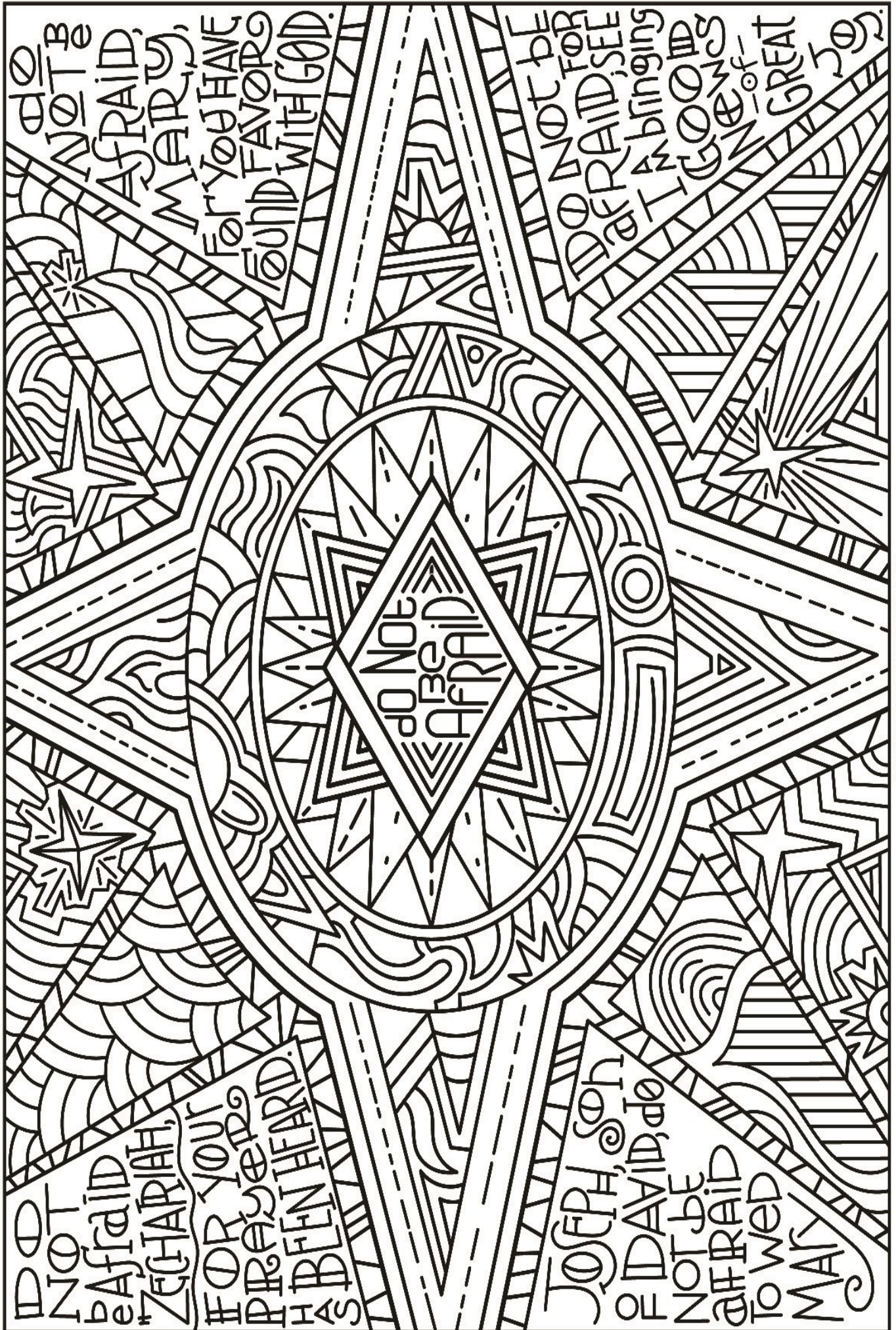
