 main Communion rail.

The Liturgy of the Word, Sunday 24th September 2017

Our sermon series for the autumn is The Greatest Story Ever Told.

In addition there will be a short and simple service of prayer in Church at 7.30pm on **Tuesday, 26th September** - this will be a time to stand alongside those suffering, as we pray and lament together. TRYING OUT DIFFERENT ARRANGEMENTS FOR COFFEE: Recently the PCC decided that we would begin to think about ways in which the space at the back of the church and in the Narthex could be best used, particularly after the 10am service when the flow of people collecting coffee and later leaving needs to be carefully managed. GARDEN OF REMEMBRANCE A member of the Council's Environment Volunteers scheme has offered to attend to the Garden of Remembrance. However, stones surrounding memorial tablets present a mowing hazard and can become dangerous projectiles when strimming and prevent trimming up to the tablets. We are sympathetic to concerns that may have arisen during the period when the grass was being mown less frequently by the council and understand that relatives may have wanted to preserve memorial tablets from the surrounding longer grass. The Environment Volunteer's participation will remedy the difficulty and there should no longer be a problem keeping memorial tablets neat and tidy. We would be grateful if stones can be removed by the end of October on the understanding that any remaining stones will be removed after that time. This is in compliance with regulations regarding the care of churchyards revised by the Diocese of Leicester in 2014.

"It's good to be back.....I'm off again now"

It is really good to be back in the parish after a wonderful holiday in Iceland followed by the Diocesan Conference at Swanwick. However, on Oct 1st I'm off again, starting my placement at Peterborough Cathedral, which will be full time for aprox 5 weeks. Leicester Diocese requires that all curates undertake a placement during their 3rd year (yes, it's almost unbelievable that this is my 3rd year at St Mary's). The placement should be in a context that is different from any of my previous experience, so I have agreed with Adrian and the diocese that this will be a great opportunity for me. I am also deeply grateful to the Diocese of Peterborough for making this possible and particularly to The Revd Canon Tim Alban Jones. Acting Precentor, Acting Dean and Chaplain to the Bishop of Peterborough, who will be my supervisor.

During my time in Peterborough I will be involved in many aspects of cathedral life, leading worship, working on the various teams (vergers, welcoming, cathedral chaplaincy) as well as various staff and management team and meetings. It is also hoped that I will have some involvement with the city church of St John the Baptist in the cathedral square. This church works closely with the cathedral and is involved in social action within the city.

Directly after this placement I have an IME training day followed by a short retreat at Walsingham before re-joining St Mary's on Sat 11th Nov. In His service, Neil
