EVERYDAY FAITH

All of us need to keep growing in our faith and looking out for ways in which we can help others and make a difference. When we do this we are moving from a 'Sunday faith' that's restricted to church on a single day of the week, to an 'Everyday Faith' that shapes our whole lives and all our relationships.

One simple way to support our Everyday Faith is to ensure that we start and end each day with a simple prayer. But even when we are distracted, God is pleased when we offer a prayer and, over time, we are changed by this regular practice.

A prayer in the morning.

A prayer in the evening

Thank you Lord, for the gift of this day past, and for all you have done for me.
Bless those I have met or remembered; heal and restore any I have hurt.
Forgive me for selfishness and lack of love, and may I forgive any hurt to me.
Hold me in the peace of Jesus tonight.
Amen.
