





As you'll know, Cecilia is in her final year of training at the moment, and is on placement with us here. She'll be ordained at Petertide in 2023 (end of June/ start of July) and then we will welcome her into a new full-time role serving both our Knighton churches and parishes. News of the death of John Fidoe: Our former church member and friend to many, John Fidoe, died recently, at his care home in Sheffield, aged 96. John, a former Police Officer, was for many years, a loyal and regular member of the St Mary's Choir although profoundly deaf. His son Michael lives close by with his wife Wendy, while his daughter Beth and her husband Simon live in Australia. After a private cremation in Sheffield, his ashes will be interred next year, here in Knighton, in our Garden of Remembrance, with those of his wife Kath, who died in January 2017. 'Advent Pilgrimage' Service: On Sunday 27th November at 6.30pm we will mark Advent Sunday with a reflective service of readings, choral music, hymns and prayers, called 'Do not be afraid!' This is a slightly different format for our Advent evening service, and is designed to take us on a journey through Advent, looking at the message of the angels to Zechariah, Joseph, Mary and the Shepherds: *'Do not be afraid!'* Please do come and join us.

This service is led by the Bishop and usually draws together 'candidates' of all ages and backgrounds from different churches. In early 2023 there are two local Confirmation services taking place: 10.30am, Sunday 22 January at The Church of the Martyrs and then 2.00pm, Sunday 19 February at St Margaret's Church.
