The campaign to save our spire

We now have a fund-raising committee, whose role is to define and market the spire project, encourage people throughout the community to get involved, and approve and schedule specific fund-raising proposals.

The aim is to raise **£40,000** from our own local efforts towards the estimated cost of £200,000.

This is not only about bricks - or stones - and mortar; or about heritage - important though those things all are. Like our medieval predecessors who built the tower and added the spire, this is about calling out to our community, involving them, telling we are here. And why.

We hope everyone in the congregation will be proud to support and take part in this project.

It should also be a lot of fun. We have already come up with an impressive list of possible events, including the Christmas tree festival this December, and an open gardens weekend across Knighton next year. There will be a formal launch in September, but there will be plenty happening before then.

Don't assume we've already thought of everything. More ideas are very welcome. So are people willing to take a lead in organising specific events: one small co-ordinating group can't do it all. In particular we are also looking for someone with design skills to help with posters and publicity, someone with website design skills and another someone who will help us with the process of registering the church as a film location. NOTE - You can now contribute your loose change to the 'Be Inspired' 1p saving Challenge in the box beneath the large poster at the back of the church - don't forget to add up your pennies and tick off the appropriate box on the poster as you make your donation.
