COMING UP What's happening at St Mary's on Sundays in April and May 2024

Sunday services at St Mary's vary, week by week – we hope that this provides different types of worship that appeal in different ways and, perhaps, are appreciated by different groups of people. Everyone is welcome at 10.30am, any and every Sunday!

- The month ends with Sung Eucharist on **Sunday 28th April**, again looking at the resurrection appearances of Jesus. This service will be followed by our Annual Church Meeting (APCM) at 11.45am.
- Our All Age Worship begins the new month on Sunday 5th May and our theme will be "On the Edge!"
- On **Sunday 12th May** we celebrate a Sung Eucharist, including, at its heart, Holy Communion, and marking the start of *Christian Aid Week*. In the evening that day we welcome friends from other local churches to a special ecumenical service for *Christian Aid Week*, starting at 6.30pm.
- The third Sunday of the month, **19th May**, is also **Pentecost**, the 'birthday of the Church'. Our Morning Worship together takes the theme of *"Pentecost Praise"*.
- On Sunday 26th May, Trinity Sunday, we again celebrate a Sung Eucharist and look ahead to the long weeks of 'Ordinary Time' through the summer.
- As usual, **each Sunday** our quieter, **Weekly Eucharist**, takes place at 9am, with 'traditional language' on the second and fourth Sundays of the month. Our weekly midweek Communion is on Tuesdays at 9.30am, and on the last Friday of each month, at 11am, we hold a Service of Prayer for Healing, with Holy Communion.

Can you help to share "Hymns We Love" ?

Our Wednesday morning small group has been hearing all about a selection of 'Hymns We Love" over the last few weeks. Each week we begin with coffee and biscuits, and then watch a short video, listen to the hymn sung and hear about its origins, the Christian ideas behind it and how it remains relevant to our modern lives and faith. We end with some lively discussion about the questions the hymn poses to us today.

These conversations and videos about 'Hymns We Love' are a gentle and thoughtful way to introduce the Christian faith to friends and neighbours, or perhaps help them reconnect with the church. Now we want to share them beyond Wednesday mornings!



Ideally, we'd like to run the discussions once more, but this time in a home, with invitations spread more widely to include more people. Could you be the person to commit yourself as host for 90 minutes on five mornings, afternoons or evenings for *'Hymns We Love'*? All the organisation, publicity and leading can be

done by Cecilia or me, once we have our venue established.

Please reflect on how much *you* have gained through your Christian faith over the years, and how your help in this way might mean that other people too, could come to share our faith. Do talk to us if you'd like to know more. Thank you! *Adrian*

My 25 Years at the BBC Dave Andrews

Dave will talk about his 21 years at BBC Radio Leicester. He presented almost every programme on the Station and reported and commentated on many notable events including the Richard III story and the late Queen's visits.



Dave is a local resident of Knighton. He began his teaching career in Leicestershire before joining the BBC in 2000. He chaired the long running and record-breaking gardening programme 'Down to Earth' for many years and spearheaded the Station's 40th birthday Ruby Rainbow Appeal which raised over £600 000 for Rainbows Children's Hospice. He was made a Deputy Lord-Lieutenant of Leicestershire in 2015.
