# COMING UP ...... What's happening at St Mary's on Sundays in May and June 2025

Our 10.30am Sunday services at St Mary's vary, week by week – we hope that this provides different types of worship that appeal in different ways and, perhaps, are appreciated by different groups of people. Everyone is welcome every week!

- Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> May is the third of the month and so we meet for Morning Worship.
- We finish the month on Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> May with a Sung Eucharist, reflecting on the conversion of the 'outsider' Lydia.
- **Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> June** is the first of the new month and so we celebrate with **Worship for the Whole Church**, our new name for 'All Age Worship', emphasising that there is a place for everyone. This is the Sunday after the Ascension, so we remember Jesus's commission to his disciples as he returned to heaven.
- On **Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> June**, we meet for a Sung Eucharist celebrating Pentecost and the gift of the Holy Spirit to Christians through the ages.
- The third Sunday of the month is 15<sup>th</sup> June, and our Morning Worship will take us into the mystery of the Three-in-One God as we celebrate Trinity Sunday.
- On Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> June we will meet to share Holy Communion in a service of Sung Eucharist, beginning a new theme for the summer – watch this space!
- We have an extra Sunday this month, on 29<sup>th</sup> June, and our joint Eucharist service for the whole benefice will be at 10.30am and at St Guthlac's please do come... it's not that far!

As usual, **each Sunday** our quieter, **Weekly Eucharist**, takes place at 9am, with 'traditional language' on the second and fourth Sundays of the month. Our weekly midweek Communion is on Tuesdays at 9.30am, and on the last Friday of each month, at 11am, we hold a Service of Prayer for Healing, with Holy Communion.
