### **News from the PCC (Church Council)**

The PCC (or Church Council) meets regularly through the year to discuss and decide on the major issues of our church life together, including those that relate to our worship, outreach, buildings, and our finances. At our most recent meeting this week, we considered different Bible verses that might sum up the message that we need to take on board in these challenging times. There was unanimity in agreeing on this:

***"Have I not commanded you? (says the LORD). Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the LORD your God will be with you wherever you go."*** (Joshua 1.9)

The PCC has also agreed in principle on proposals to install a more secure ramp, for wheelchair users and those who find steps difficult, up to the sanctuary in the Lady Chapel. This will provide better access to the main chancel/choir area of the church for those leading worship. There will be an opportunity for everyone in the congregation to see the plans, hear more about the proposals and give your views, in the weeks to come.

## **Report from the PCC (continued)**

Many of you know that we have been looking at a major upgrading of the church sound system, and we have now agreed a professional quote for a completely new system. It will, however, be up to six months before it can be installed, due to the gathering of permissions and the ordering of equipment.

The 'Place of Peace' project continues to evolve. Following our consultation with the congregation, we are now seeking a redesign of plans for the area at the end of the Garden of Remembrance.

The PCC took a long look at our financial situation, and noted that giving from the congregation and income from the Parish Centre have still not returned to their pre-pandemic levels. We have made savings where we can and have confirmed that we will benefit from Government relief on energy bills. However, we still expect to be in an operating deficit at the end of the year. Our reserves allow for this, but we are agreed that they should be used to support major church projects rather than on-going expenditure. We all need to increase our regular giving, therefore, to support the life and work of the church.

Considering the financial pressure and the other major projects currently underway, the PCC have agreed, with regret, that the employment of a Children's Pioneer Worker should be put on hold for the time being.

As befits a very sensitive and difficult subject, the discussions took place in an atmosphere of respect and care with speakers covering various themes interspersed with prayer and small group discussion. ## **City of Leicester Singers Concert—An Evening of Mozart**

Saturday 12th November at 7.30pm in St James the Greater Church, London Road. For their Autumn 2022 concert, The City of Leicester Singers will present an evening of choral music by Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart. The first half comprises the Missa Brevis in G, K140, is also known as the Pastoral Mass and the Litaniae Lauretanae, K195, is also known as the Litany of Loreto or Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary, The second half begins with the well-known Ave Verum Corpus (Hail, true body), K618.
