#### **ABOUT OUR SERVICES**

- Our worship follows the printed order of service and the readings and hymns are on an additional sheet. Large print versions are available from the sidespersons (the welcomers at the door).
- If you are using a hearing aid, please switch it to the T position so as to make best use of the hearing loop system.
- It is traditional to stand for the hymns and some of the prayers and readings, but if this is difficult for you then please do remain seated and comfortable.
- In the entrance area are toilets, and there is a crèche area at the back of the church. During the service there are activities in the entrance area for children of all ages, at Sunday Club.
- As part of each service we share Communion together and everyone
  is invited to come forwards to receive bread and wine as we
  remember the sacrifice of Jesus Christ. If you would prefer to come
  for a blessing then simply carry the service booklet with you.
- At 10.00am, non-alcoholic communion wine is available on request in the Lady Chapel (to the left) and gluten free wafers on request at the main Communion rail.
- You are welcome to join Adrian for a short time of prayer before the main service: 9.30-9.45am at the front of the Lady Chapel (the chapel on the left).
- Please talk to the sidespersons if you have any other questions and do please stay after the 10.00 am service for tea or coffee and introduce yourself to some of us.

# **Listening to God's Word**

Our Bible readings today are:

1 Samuel 16.1-13 and Luke 5.17-26

Today's theme is:

Jesus begins: "Remarkable things...."

**ADVANCE NOTICE!** This year our Church Annual Meeting (APCM) will be on Sunday 7th April at 11.30am, after the morning service. We will have coffee and cakes to keep us going! Everyone who thinks of themselves as part of our church family ought to be there, if at all possible, to hear reports and questions on our life together last year and to take part in the election of Church Wardens and Church Council (PCC) members. Sadly this date, which was determined by Easter and our planning and accounting timetables, means that we will not be able to have the regular 11.30am Communion service that morning - my apologies. Our Annual Report will be available for everyone sometime before the meeting as usual. *Adrian* 

PANCAKES, ASHES, SOUL SEARCHING.... AND A GOOD NATTER. It won't be long now before we begin that season in the Church's life that we call Lent. Through these weeks until Easter we consider the final days of Jesus's life before the crucifixion and we live with a greater awareness of our own need to turn away from the wrong in our life and turn back to God. Although many of us mark Shrove Tuesday or Pancake day, the first day of Lent is Ash Wednesday, which this year falls on **6th March**. As usual we have a benefice service that evening, at 7.30pm in St Mary's. This gives us an important opportunity to start our own reflections on what God might want to change in our lives and our own part in making that happen. The service includes the traditional 'ashing' when the minister marks the sign of the cross on each forehead as a symbol of our penitent turning towards a crucified Saviour. Ash Wednesday is also a traditional day for Christians to practice fasting (going without food for some time), again as a symbol of our repentance.

We will also be having our Lent Discussion Groups once again. This year we will be discussing and debating our Lent series of Sunday sermons that focus on what it means to have 'Faith For Life'. Our Wednesday morning group will meet at 10am, beginning on 13th March, at Doreen White's house, 2 Shanklin Gardens. Our Thursday evening group will meet at the Vicarage at 7.45pm, beginning on 14th March. Please think about joining us even if this sort of group is new to you - everyone is very friendly and relaxed and you won't be put on the spot at all! Do sign up on the list at the back of the church on the green boards. *Adrian*


