WW1 FUNDING APPLICATION SUCCESSFUL! The joint parishes planning group for our World War 1 Heritage Project has been successful in our bid for financial support from the Knighton Ward Councillors Fund. The grant of £1,100 means that we can continue planning events for November 2018 to mark the Centenary of the Armistice in the Great War with the confidence of the funding we need to make them a reality. Look out for further details as the year progresses.

- Our worship follows the printed order of service and the readings and hymns are on an additional sheet. Large print versions are available from the sidespersons (the welcomers at the door).
- If you are using a hearing aid, please switch it to the T position so as to make best use of the hearing loop system.
- It is traditional to stand for the hymns and some of the prayers and readings, but if this is difficult for you then please do remain seated and comfortable.
- In the entrance area are toilets, and there is a crèche area at the back of the church.
- During the service there are activities in the entrance area for children of all ages, at Sunday Club.
- As part of each service we share Communion together and everyone is invited to come forwards to receive bread and wine as we remember the sacrifice of Jesus Christ. If you would prefer to come for a blessing then simply carry the service booklet with you.
- At 10.00am, non-alcoholic communion wine is available on request in the Lady Chapel (to the left) and gluten free wafers on request at the main Communion rail.
- Please talk to the sidespersons if you have any other questions and do please stay after the 10.00 am service for tea or coffee and introduce yourself to some of us.

WW1 CENTENARY


The WW1 display in St Mary's will include photographs, memorabilia and artefacts from the period spanning1914 - 1918.
