Eucharist this Sunday, 20th November - this Sunday we will mark the celebration of Christ the King in our main service at 10.30am. As usual on the third Sunday of the month our worship will be supported by the musicians and singers of our band, and will have a less traditional form, but this month we will also be sharing in the Eucharist as part of the service, in a way that is especially accessible for our children and young people, some of whom will be receiving Communion for the first time. In line with Church of England guidance, they have all been prepared for this important step in their journey of faith - we welcome them as they join our 'Eucharistic fellowship'. *Adrian*

Office closure Please note that James is taking some annual leave over the next three weeks. Generally the office will be open on Thursdays and Fridays. This week the office is closed Tuesday 22nd and Wednesday 23rd but will be open Thursday and Friday.

'**Advent Pilgrimage' Service:** On Sunday 27th November at 6.30pm we will mark Advent Sunday with a reflective service of readings, choral music, hymns and prayers, called 'Do not be afraid!' This is a slightly different format for our Advent evening service, and is designed to take us on a journey through Advent, looking at the message of the angels to Zechariah, Joseph, Mary and the Shepherds: 'Do not be afraid!' Please do come and join us.

Your next step on the journey of faith? You may be feeling that you've grown in faith through 2022 and that it's time to recognise that in some way. In the Church of England there is a special service for teenagers and adults who want to affirm the Christian faith for themselves, called Confirmation. This service is led by the Bishop and usually draws together 'candidates' of all ages and backgrounds from different churches. In early 2023 there are two local Confirmation services taking place: 10.30am, Sunday 22 January at The Church of the Martyrs and then 2.00pm, Sunday 19 February at St Margaret's Church. If you think this might be the next step in *your* journey of faith then do have a chat with me in the next few weeks, and I can tell you all about it. *Adrian*
