A warm welcome to everyone joining us at St Mary Magdalen this week, especially if you are here for the first time or visiting. On the next page of this newsletter you'll find all the essential information you might need for this morning's service.

TODAY - our normal Eucharist services will take place at 8am and 10am. In the evening, at 6.30pm, for about 45 minutes, we have a quieter and reflective time called "Blue Christmas". This will provide an opportunity to those of us who find Christmas a difficult or troubling season, to escape for a while from the non-stop jollity. There will be some prayers, readings and quiet music to listen to, but no carols! Please do talk about this to friends and neighbours as well, as there are many people who might appreciate this time to pause, even if they don't feel particularly 'blue' at the moment. ABOUT OUR SERVICES

• Our worship follows the printed order of service and the readings and hymns are on an additional sheet. Large print versions are available from the sidespersons (the welcomers at the door).

• If you are using a hearing aid, please switch it to the T position so as to make best use of the hearing loop system.

• It is traditional to stand for the hymns and some of the prayers and readings, but if this is difficult for you then please do remain seated and comfortable.

• In the entrance area there are toilets, and there is a crèche area at the back of the church. During the service on 23rd December there are activities in the entrance area for children of all ages, at Sunday Club. On the 30th December Sunday Club has a break."

• When we share Communion together everyone is invited to come forwards to receive bread and wine as we remember the sacrifice of Jesus Christ. If you would prefer to come for a blessing then simply carry the service booklet with you.

• At our 10am and Midnight services, non-alcoholic communion wine is available on request in the Lady Chapel (to the left) and gluten free wafers on request at the main Communion rail.

• Please talk to the sidespersons if you have any other questions and do please stay after the 10.00 am service for tea or coffee and introduce yourself to some of us.
