WELCOME BISHOP GULI It's a pleasure to welcome Bishop Guli to preside and preach at our Sung Eucharist today. Bishop Guli was born in Iran, where her father was also a bishop, but as a teenager she fled with her family during the aftermath of the Iranian Islamic Revolution and settled in the UK. She is the first Bishop of Loughborough and has a specific responsibility for encouraging vocations in the diocese and helping our churches become more ethnically diverse. It's a privilege to have her joining us at St Mary Magdalen today. *Adrian*

ABOUT OUR SERVICES

- Our worship follows the printed order of service and the readings and hymns are on an additional sheet. Large print versions are available from the sidespersons (the welcomers at the door).
