Our Bible readings for Sunday 25th September are: James 5.1-7 and Matthew 15.32-39 'Before we say goodbye' : In last week's Sunday service we considered the truth, sadness and hope that we find in facing the fact that we will each, one day, die. As a result you may now be thinking ahead - about being in the right place with God and with other people, about plans for your own time of dying and about the funeral to follow.
