



The death of Vic Ironmonger: It's with great sadness that I have to tell you that our friend Vic Ironmonger died on Tuesday evening. Vic had been in hospital for a few days but deteriorated rapidly at the weekend and died unexpectedly but peacefully.

He and his wife Rita were very involved in church life until failing health meant they had to step back. Sadly, Maurice died a few days ago. I'm pleased to say that at St Mary's at 10.30am on Sunday 22nd we will host, as preacher, the Rev'd Leigh Greenwood from Stoneygate Baptist Church, while I will be preaching for them. I hope that you'll put the date on your calendar and help to give Leigh a warm welcome. *Adrian*

Advance notice! This month has five Sundays, and as usual we'll be taking the fifth as an opportunity for a joint benefice service, where we join together with the congregation of St Guthlac's to worship, pray, learn, and get to know each other better. On **Sunday 29th January** we will join together at St Mary's for a Eucharist, and to hear Susan Littlemore, a speaker from **Christians Against Poverty** - see below for more information about CAP. As we aim to bring all our church members together in the one service on this Sunday, there won't be a 9am Eucharist at St Mary's that day.

Christians Against Poverty was founded in 1996 by John Kirkby. He believed God was calling him to sacrifice his career in finance and use his knowledge of the industry to help those in need.In his hometown of Bradford, John began to use his expertise to help ordinary people weighed down by debt and unable to make ends meet, to support families facing eviction and to bring hope to desperate people trapped by poverty. In partnership with local churches and other committed volunteers trained as debt counsellors, John expanded the network of CAP centres to other areas of the country. Today, as well as offering debt help, Christians Against Poverty offer practical advice about living well on a low income through Life Skills groups, and support people stepping into employment through CAP Job Clubs. Through this UK-wide network of projects, CAP have a vision of transformed lives, thriving churches and an end to UK poverty. All Christians and churches are invited to be part of this essential service of others.
