Sunday 31<sup>st</sup> August is the fifth Sunday of the month and so we have a joint benefice service, this time at

St Mary's. These services are a great opportunity for our two congregations, from both St Guthlac's and St Mary's, to meet, mingle and, more importantly, to worship together.

On this occasion we'll be remembering one of the great 'cloud of witnesses', Christians from the past 'commended for their faith' (Hebrews 11) and who give us an inspiring example to follow:

John Bunyan (1628-1688) was an English preacher and author of "The Pilgrim's Progress", one of the most influential Christian books of all time and never out of print since its first publication. Please do join us at St Mary's, 10.30am, as we reflect on how to avoid 'the Slough of Despond' and 'Vanity Fair' and keep our focus on what it means today 'To be a Pilgrim' on the way to 'the Celestial City'.

## COMING UP ...... What's happening at St Mary's on Sundays in August and September 2025

Our 10.30am Sunday services at St Mary's vary, week by week – we hope that this provides different types of worship that appeal in different ways and, perhaps, are appreciated by different groups of people. Everyone is welcome every week!

- We have an extra Sunday this month, on 31<sup>st</sup> August, and our joint Eucharist service for the whole benefice will be at 10.30am and at St Mary's this time – please do come.
- **Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> September** is the first of the new month and so we celebrate with **Worship for the Whole Church**, our new name for 'All Age Worship', emphasising that there is a place for everyone. We'll be hearing about some Christians who have made their mark on the world ...including (as we begin Creationtide) St Francis.
- We meet together for a Sung Eucharist on Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> September, the second Sunday of Creationtide.
- On Sunday 21<sup>st</sup> September we praise God together in Morning Worship, with the band and choir to lead us.
- The last Sunday of the month is 28<sup>th</sup> September, and we share a Sung Eucharist.
- Advance notice! Our Harvest Festival for Everyone is on Sunday
   5<sup>th</sup> October!

As usual, **each Sunday** our quieter, **Weekly Eucharist**, takes place at 9am, with 'traditional language' on the second and fourth Sundays of the month. Our weekly midweek Communion is on Tuesdays at 9.30am, and on the last Friday of each month, at 11am, we hold a Service of Prayer for Healing, with Holy Communion.

Ride and Stride, Saturday 13th September This annual fundraiser for the Leicestershire Historic Churches Trust will be with us again soon. It's a sponsored event involving either walking or riding between Leicestershire churches. If you would like to be a 'rider and strider' then you can find a sponsorship form on the table at the back of the church. Alternatively, you could volunteer to help out at the St Mary's ride-and-stride registration table for a 1-2 hour period sometime between 10:00-18:00 on that Saturday. And finally, if you could sponsor a rider-and-strider (churchwarden Sian will be one of them) that would be great. Half of the money raised ultimately is given back to our church. 
# "Journey in Faith" – could this be your next step in the growth of your Christian faith and life?








# Tea & Talk Summer Read


